#### TRANSFORMERS

Last Spring, one of our Grace House students and Passion Collective members graduated. It was a big day! Years of grueling work in school, of countless hours serving coffee and welcoming fellow students, were coming to fruition.

This student (now graduate) had trained as an environmental engineer. They soon accepted a role with an company that works heavily on Atlanta's civic infrastructure.

Now, whenever I see a newly paved road, I wonder if this student had a hand in making it happen. Quite literally, this person is transforming our city.

Georgia Tech's students change the world. Their fingerprints are all around our city, our country and our world. The list of notable alumni is long and illustrious. But as followers of Christ, we believe that it is not enough to make an impact – at a minimum it must be an impact that bears good fruit. Ideally, we want to see students making the Good News of Jesus Christ and the Kingdom more manifest in the world.



Grace House exists to equip students to make that kind of an impact – the kind of impact that goes beyond just making a mark and instead see

goes beyond just making a mark and instead seeks lasting transformation.

A personal encounter with Christ's love is the first step to making that kind of transformation possible. We emulate Christ's incarnation and dwell among students. We serve coffee. We laugh together. We offer band-aids and nail polish remover. We welcome the young women in the middle of the night who have fled a party where they didn't feel safe. We pray with students who are processing another death by suicide on campus.

These are the moments where students both meet and deeply experience God's love. Our Bible studies, worship services and prayer gatherings are vital spaces where students take that encounter further and start to build a lasting relationship.

We strongly believe that when students experience the transformative power of Jesus' love, their impact is not only greater, but it is also qualitatively distinct from what they could achieve without this transformation.

Whether a student is just starting to explore their faith or has been on the journey for years, we are here to create spaces where God's love can transform them, because *transformed* students *transform* the world.

Your support is making this possible every day, and we are eager to see what God has in store for the coming year.

#### MORE THAN COFFEE

At Grace House we understand that in order to connect with students spiritually we need to attend to them holistically. Our programs are marked by radical love, safe inquiry and inclusive justice. They are designed to ensure that students encounter Christ's love through both word and deed every time they step into Grace House.

Here are a few ways we do that:


- Serving free coffee every week
- Small groups for Scripture study
- Weekly dinner and worship
- 1 on 1 meetings with students to discuss theology and life
- Free food + toiletries pantry on-site

In addition to these core practices, Georgia Tech itself has called upon us to address needs that the University cannot on their own. For example, we have been called upon to support timely and



effective aid to students in crisis. We have also been asked to provide memorial services and pastoral care for the student body when a student dies by suicide.

By caring for students in body, mind and spirit, we offer space for students to be transformed by God's love.

Served students 10,400 cups of coffee





#### TRANSFORMING THE WORLD



Rachel joined our worship gathering during the 2021 / 2022 academic year. They made an immediate impression. During a discussion on the Book of Revelation, Rachel dove into an in-depth explanation of the "tree of life" and the "tree of the knowledge of good and evil."

Over the next few months, Rachel got to know Grace House and had many conversations with Pastor Andrew. They talked about their family, schooling, relationships and their views on faith. They wrestled with various theological concepts for years, including faith, salvation, judgment and the inerrancy of scripture. Rachel was seeking clear answers to these complex questions. They were open to exploring.

Over time, Rachel became more open to the possibilities of the Spirit. They embraced the mystery of faith while holding onto the foundational truths: God loves all creation, God calls us to do justice and love mercy, and God is not done working in the world.

Rachel sensed the Spirit calling them to teach particularly the younger generation. After graduating this spring, they will start a teaching position in Virginia. We are excited to see how they will grow and transform themselves and the world around them through their work!
